## Q&A Remote Learning 2021

### **Will my child be expected to complete schoolwork?**

Yes, Pre-primary to Year six are compulsory schooling years, so your child will be expected to work during WA Lockdowns, Self-isolation or School Closure. The curriculum will of course be modified by your child's teacher to ensure work is appropriate for independent learning, reduced adult support and the change to the learning environment.

Kindy and Prindy children will also be provided with learning and opportunities to stay connected with their teachers and peers.

### **Will teachers be available to answer questions?**

Yes! Classroom teachers will be available between 9 and 3 each day. Teachers will be contactable via Educa and email. They will respond to you but it may not be immediately as they may be on other calls or zoom sessions.

### **If my child is sick will they need to complete schoolwork?**

Like any school absence, whilst your child is unwell, they do not need to complete schoolwork, however they will need to do their best to catch up when they recover.

### **Do I need to contact the school if my child is unwell?**

Please keep your child's teacher up to date about your child's health so that they can record attendance as usual. Notify the school in the usual way by emailing [absent@lanceholtschool.wa.edu.au](mailto:absent@lanceholtschool.wa.edu.au)

### **Will my child need a workspace?**

Having a dedicated workspace is advisable and will assist your child to focus on their learning and build good study habits. We recommend that you consider the following in setting up the workspace:

- A place with minimal noise and distraction
- Good lighting
- Storage space for all equipment needed

### **Will my child have to follow the school timetable?**

No. We understand that families will each have different factors to consider in working out your child's timetable. We suggest that you agree upon the day's timetable before commencing each morning so that your child has clear guidelines to work within.

Some suggestions are:

- Decide which subject to do first. It often helps to do the most difficult subject first.
- Put the timetable on display.
- Negotiate the timetable with the child.
- Encourage your child to organise their materials for each lesson and pack them away when finished. Even young children are able to do this.
- Save the best subject for last.
